Tools	Definition	Examples
Symbolism	An image that stands for a larger concept, event, person, or idea.	Any of the flags, uniforms, or clothing
Labeling	A word or phrase that makes it clear who a person or what an object is.	Words or phrases like "SC" or "Mass" or "My Policy"
Irony	The use of words to express something other than and especially the opposite of the literal meaning; incongruity between the actual result of a sequence of events and the normal or expected result	The phrase "Unbroken Harmony" at the bottom of the statue.
Analogy	A comparison between two things, even a complex issue with a familiar one.	
Caricature	A good drawing of a person that isn't too exaggerated.	State of Andrew Johnson, Fernando Wood as a Winged Creature

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
